Placer Geology, what Causes Placer Gold Deposits. Contributed by Tom Fest

It starts as mineral soup...deep in the earth... under pressure, searing heat, being forced from its resting place by the earth's growing pains: Earthquakes, Subduction Zones, Volcanos...

Then other forces of nature displace the remains; and what remains is heavy. Violent wind, eruptions, erosion, storms, floods, landslides, earthquakes and glaciers move and grind the surface of the earth like a sander with an intent on making dust.

Gold is 6 times heavier than most materials out there and 19 times heavier than water. The gold settles to the bottom...as far as it can go. Rough bedrock or clay stops the gold from its travels, then the pounding by the lighter material starts: thousands of years of pounding... into a soft malleable metal forced into the cracks. The bottom is where the water travels too, if there is any. Creeks, rivers, lakes, oceans: placer or free gold has been formed and found a home: waiting for you.

So, you are looking where??? You got it... Look deep. As close to bedrock or a false bedrock (like clay) as you can get. Look for eddys in creeks and streams where it can rest. Look at natural sluices. Look for inside corners of those waterways and pry at the places the gold can be forced into. Look for sudden drops like waterfalls... Think heavy. Think bottom of the stack. Think of where the ancient rivers were. That is where we will find most placer gold...

Have fun and be safe...fill your holes...carry your Gold and Fish pamphlet.
