

Don't Drink the Water. Contributed by Robert Novak.

You hear while travelling other countries, "Don't drink the water". It's also a good warning when gold prospecting here at home. As you hike or stroll through the North American wilderness, carry plenty of water. If not, have a way to purify water.

Just because the water is crystal-clear doesn't mean it is pure. Put a few drops under a microscope and you'd see funny looking one-celled animals named giardia lamblia. Drinking the water or even brushing your teeth, you may be in trouble without disinfecting it first. If you're infected, within a week or so your upper small intestines become covered with giardia. You may not be aware of it. You may suffer nothing more than average rumbling in your belly and a few loose stools; and you may walk around unwittingly shedding giardia cysts for the next few weeks: or you may feel your stomach and intestines were turned inside out or worse. After a few days the symptoms may decrease. That's what "Beaver Fever" can do.

Drinking surface water is liking gambling with your health. You may get sick or not or you may experience a prolonged spell of indigestion, sulfurous belching, bloating, passing gas and diarrhea. So when you lift that cup of crystal-clear water to drink, ask "am I feeling lucky today".

It's hard to believe our clear mountain streams could be fouled with disease-causing parasites. It is true. Giardia is carried in the small intestines of infected humans, beavers, cows, sheep, dogs, deer and other animals. When mature they become cysts, dividing into two and passing in feces. An infected animal may spread millions of cysts each day. They may lay around on the ground or in streams for months before being eaten... and the process starts again.

Man is to be blamed for the spread of giardia to remote wilderness areas, "back-packers diarrhea" is a more fitting title.

If contracted, dehydration will result. Drink sips of water or other non alcoholic liquid. Forget solid food for a few days.

To use water in the wilderness: boil, filter, or use a chemical disinfectant.

Gold, Its Origin. Contributed by Myron Hastings

Early on in our planet's formation ores were surfaced from the earth's core. If you think about smelting where we heat rock and ore to a molten state: that is what occurred in the earth's core. It was like a gigantic smelter operation. The early-on earthquakes were like tapping the side of a crucible to help the ore and rock separate. Then the volcanos that were active eons ago vented the rock out the top of the natural smelter.

The rest of the material was ores that, through the heat, had reached their own levels purifying the ore! Then as the irritable core had birth pangs, the center of the earth's core began producing more gasses; pushing the ore upward. With this much pressure added to the ore bodies, they found the path of least resistance! Cracks air deposits suddenly began to fill with ores, agate, and other separated materials. All this happened many many years ago. As the earth began to stabilize the ore bodies, the melted materials began to cool and solidify.

As the plates shifted under the surface of the earth causing earthquakes, these ore veins would snap and shift, moving the material. In cases where the ore bodies and other materials did make it to the surface, the gasses pushing them would vent. That is where we are able to do Hard Rock mining. All rock is porous so when the exposed material is subject to rain and freezing it begins to break up and the ore washes into the rivers with the softer material breaking away from the harder material and quartz, forming nuggets of Gold through erosion.
