## Sure Fire Panning Methods DVD. Review by Ernie Stinson, Board Member and Librarian

I recommend that you get this DVD and watch and study the different methods used.

George Massie: explains Gold Pans used in the olden days up to today and briefly how to use them, what to keep and what to take out of your pan. He talks about Classifying before panning "which is easier" to pan out your material.

Perry Massie: "as well as Jake Hartwick" to me does a really great job of explaining and showing you How to Pan. If you watch any part of this DVD you need to watch Perry and study his way of panning.

John "Blueberry" A: talks about "The Blueberry Bounce" and how he came up with it. However, you should only try this method when you master panning the regular way.

Tom Massie: "Speed Panning". This method of panning should be done only just to out-pan others. You will be using a different kind of sand.

Watching this video is the way I learned how to pan for Gold. One thing to remember, do not put too much material into your pan. For the beginners, try putting only about an inch and a half or two inches of material into your pan, until you are able to handle more material. "and do not worry about how fast you have to pan your material, you will get faster as time goes by."

However, you should try to classify your material first. To classify, start by using a 5 gallon bucket and a scoop big enough to handle a couple handfuls of water, a one-half inch classifier or an one-fourth inch classifier. "you could use an one eighth inch as well." I really recommend that you wash all of your material before panning.

And may the bottom of your pan be yellow with Gold.
