

In May of 2017, I made the voyage south to the Pine Grove California area to Roaring mining Camp .This was my second time there as last year, My wife and I as well as a few other club members attended the camp for the first time. Now this year , I knew what to expect and I developed a game plan for the week long stay. I brought a couple of helpers this time (my oldest son Justin , and my youngest son Jacob). When we first arrived, I knew I wanted to "stake my claim" on a area that they call "Cesar's Wall" which is the ancient river channel where everyone can dig. The soil at this place is very rusty and high in iron so it will stain your clothes and even your skin. Since all the rain and high water this past year, I knew the river was not going to be a option to mine like it was last year so getting a good spot on the wall was crucial. There were serveral family's there again that were there last year as well as a couple of old timers that help out around camp and are really great people. One of them (Jack) has been going there since the 60's and he, and the founder of the camp back in the day found 30lbs. of gold in the Mokelumne river. I saw pictures of him holding huge pans of gold.

One great thing about this place, besides being beautiful is that the family run staff has a event going on each day and sometimes a second event in the evening. These events consist of hikes, contests, karaoke, dice roll game for gold, and one day a trip down river to another area on the property called China Camp. They also do periodic demonstrations on mining equipment that they sell. All these events are optional to attend. We stayed in a cabin which have no power, but have 2 beds and a wood stove which they have wood for if needed, and a picnic table inside and outside the cabins. Cabins and the bathrooms are clean and well stocked. Folks that don't want a cabin can tent camp. THERE IS NO CELL SERVICE, which can be kind of nice actually. You are way down in a valley over 3 miles down a steep, well cared for gravel road. Another draw for me to this place is the history here. Lots of old rusty equipment and a neat lodge type building called the trading post where you can buy food, snacks, a little restaurant they run, bar, museum and gathering place. When I walk down the steps of that place I always feel like I should get on a horse and ride off.

As for the gold, I only measured the largest nugget which came in at 1.47 grams. The total amount still remains to be seen as I still have 2 buckets of material to run.

I have made plans to attend the camp in May of 2018. If anyone has questions about the camp, please ask me. Also, I believe that Mike and Ricky, both camp employees and family members are planning to be at the local 2018 Gold and Treasure show so they will have plenty of information on the camp.
