#### NOME TRIP

There were over 40 of us plus Randy Harpers crew who made the trip to Nome this year. Everyone had a good time. It was very educational and relaxing for the most part. I know several of our members had to catch up on sleep when they returned home as they took full advantage of the extended daylight hours. People were mining, metal detecting, riding the 4 wheelers and exploring until 2/3/and 4 in the morning.

Some of the activities we took advantage of were fishing, some did much better than others, tours, and collecting sea glass.

The first week the weather was rainy and breezy, but not cold, very few biting bugs. The second week was sunny a little breezy and again few biting bugs, For the most part during the day t-shirt and or light jacket weather.

We also played cards, and visited with other members in the lodge. We got to know our fellow chapter members much better.

We have another AKAU Lodge trip scheduled next year For July 20<sup>th</sup> thru 26<sup>th</sup>.

Here are a few things you need to know.

Flying time is around 12 hrs and in most cases will have lay over{s}. You will change planes.

Other than a metal detector, scoop, and viles, you really don't need a lot of equipment. Most of it is provided.

Chest waders are recommended along with a rain suit.

Some mining equipment, esp. hi bankers are to be shared. Treat your fellow miner as you want to be treated.

4 wheelers are available to rent and if you want to do much exploring you will need one.

Everything is expensive, it has to be shipped or flown in. A 6 pk of brand name pop was almost \$10, a 2 liter bottle was \$5.49, bananas were \$1.79 a lb

People are very nice and are friendly.

If you want to fish and need transportation the lodge will take you. They provide the poles but it is a good idea to bring lures etc. An out of state lic. Was \$25 for one day. If you want to learn to fish or proper mining practices, the lodge folks will teach you.

The 2<sup>nd</sup> week we had about 8-10 people who had not run a hi banker. Some need to learn to pan, metal detect, and dredging. There was other equipment to learn also.

The price for next years trip will be \$1300 for the week that includes meals .

The current age for children was 12 years of age, but that may be raised to 14, or high school age.

Keep in mind this is an opportunity to learn the history of Nome and surrounding area, learn and participate in mining and just enjoy you fellow miners.

This is a vacation and adventure. Do not expect to make your fortune or get rich. That is not realistic and you will be disappointed. If you catch the real gold fever you will not have fun.

Please give Preston a quick report on the condition of the claim, access to the claim, and any gold you may find, etc. It is a good idea to take a trash bag with you so that if you find any trash you can carry it out with you. Our Chapter members who might not be a GPAA or LDMA member can accompany a current GPAA or LDMA member on the claim but are only allowed to be a dredge tender, hi banker helper, or you can pan. Having a full access at any time is another good reason to be a GPAA or LDMA member.
