I am writing to let you know that the Washington Fish and Wildlife Commission amended the Hydraulic Code mineral prospecting rules on April 9, 2021. The changes will become effective May 20, 2021. These changes implement Engrossed Substitute House Bill (ESHB) 1261 - a bill passed by the legislature during the 2020 legislative session. Rule amendments include:

Specifying that a standard Hydraulic Project Approval permit (HPA) is required to conduct mineral prospecting involving motorized or gravity siphon equipment;

Removing all motorized mineral prospecting activities from the Gold and Fish pamphlet permit;

Requiring proof of compliance with the federal Clean Water Act as part of a complete application for an HPA for mineral prospecting with motorized or gravity siphon equipment;

Specifying that WDFW may reject an application for mineral prospecting involving motorized or gravity siphon equipment if the proposed project location or locations occur where the Department of Ecology prohibits those activities under <u>RCW 90.48</u>.615;

- Eliminating the annual reporting requirement for suction dredging HPAs; and
- Requiring aquatic invasive species prevention measures for motorized or gravity siphon equipment.

An updated version of the Gold and Fish pamphlet will be available on the <u>mineral prospecting web page</u> shortly before the rules take effect.

Before conducting any mineral prospecting with motorized or gravity siphon equipment, WDFW recommends visiting the <u>Department of Ecology's mineral prospecting web site</u> to learn more about prohibitions and new permitting requirements enacted in ESHB 1261.
